Household Inventory

According to the Sheriff's Department, thieves target items that can be easily pawned, sold to a fence or sold at a swap meet. The Sheriff's Department suggests engraving these items with the initial of your last name and the last four digits of your Driver's License. The Hidden Valley Neighborhood Watch will have the engraving equipment for you to borrow.

The following items are examples and are not intended to be inclusive: Adding Machines and Calculators, Appliances, Bicycles, Binoculars, Blenders, Cameras, CB Radios, Compact Disk Players, Clocks, Computer Equipment, Fishing Equipment, Furniture, Golf Clubs, Guns, Hub Caps, Mag Wheels, Microwave Ovens, Mixers, Motorcycles, Radios, Sewing Machines, Sports Equipment, Stereo Equipment Tape Decks, Television Sets, Tools, Video Camcorders and virtually anything else that can be turned into quick cash.

Ideally, engraving should be done in two places – in one obvious place and in one hidden place. Engraving should be on a solid component, not on an area that can be easily replaced by the thief. The back of this sheet is to be used for listing your possessions. Keep it in a safe but readily accessible place. When you decide to sell an engraved item, draw a single line through your identification number. If you try to obliterate it completely, the assumption will be made that it is stolen.

With this Inventory List, you should also keep a listing of your Credit Cards. The information should include the Credit Card Company, Account Number and the Phone Number for reporting a lost or stolen card.
